1 *With a bridge over tranquil backwoods*, the architects at **Rockspire** are once again dreaming big. Spanning 120 feet and rising 15 feet above a creek bed, these concept drawings show a walkway and bridge that create a shortcut from Betty's Birdhouse to the Upper Nature Trail. Supported by concrete and steel, the composite wood deck walkway traverses a wet weather waterfall and rocky paths that most visitors find intimidating to maneuver.

With the cabin on one side, and "Deborah's Leap" on the other -- the leap so named after Deborah's near spill over the cliffs in the truck -- walkers will safely connect to the trail for hiking, rock climbing, cave sighting, or even yoga meditation. Construction of the bridge is hoped to start early 2013 and will be named in memory of Mike Johnson's father, Maurice.

2 *Rockspire Properties* has been working with the **Eureka Springs Fire Department Emergency Medical Service** which recently designated the Rockspire Helipad near the MobbyMac Carriage House as the **Trigger Gap LZ** (landing zone) for emergency medical evacuations.

First responders are able to use the MobbyMac Carriage House for emergency triage to establish if the patient needs to be transported to the Eureka Springs Hospital by ambulance or whether a helicopter will need to transport the patient directly from Rockspire to a hospital in Fayetteville, Springdale, Little Rock, or Springfield, Missouri. Improvements to the Rockspire Helipad should be completed soon, however it is operational for emergency use now!




